
OUR GUIDING PRINCIPLES

We therefore align our objectives with the country's National Strategy for Transformation (NST), with Agenda 2063 for the Africa We Want, and with the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
- **5.** We invest in harnessing the power of innovation and technology: it gives us, on a scale and speed never before possible, the opportunity to further our impact, and tap into latest trends and developments.



EDUCATION PROGRAMMES





This holistic approach includes improving learning outcomes through remedial support for under-performing students, supporting high-achieving students from vulnerable backgrounds, and empowering girls to excel in education as well empowering parents and the community with the right tools to nurture and protect them.



EARLY CHILDHOOD DEVELOPMENT AND FAMILY (ECD&F)



In 2013, Imbuto Foundation in partnership with the Government of Rwanda and UNICEF, launched the ECD&F programme to support the holistic development of children aged 0 to 6. The goal of the programme is to ensure that all children achieve their full developmental potential, while their families and communities are empowered with the right tools to nurture and protect them.

The ECD&F programme uses the following approaches:

- ECD centres (3 to 6 years old)
- Home-based services (3 to 6 years old)
- Home visits (0 to 3 years old)

In addition, parents receive training and support in Income Generating Activities (IGAs). Imbuto Foundation offers and delivers the integrated ECD services in all 30 districts.

Face of Imbuto - Helene Mukamana

ECD&7 Programme



My name is Helene, I live in a rural village called Bumba in Gakenke sector. My experience with Imbuto Foundation has been truly transformative. I used to struggle with anger and often resorted to harsh punishments with my children.

However, through the programme, I have learned to adopt a more peaceful approach, nurturing calm conversations and embracing gentle parenting for a more harmonious household.

This programme has been instrumental in improving communication within our family. Both my husband and I have been actively involved in supporting our children and that has helped them excel in school. I am deeply grateful for the programme's impact on our lives and strongly advocate for additional parents training sessions.

My journey highlights how programmes like these can positively transform not only individual families but also entire communities. By promoting positive parenting approaches and facilitating economic empowerment, this programme contributes to comprehensive community development.

Early Childhood Development has been linked to improved adolescent and adult welfare, by strengthening the cognitive capacities of children. Imbuto Foundation has facilitated the creation of over 5,800 ECD spaces across Rwanda.





TWIGE NEZA DUTSINDE



Twige Neza Dutsinde programme aims to improve learning outcomes for students in basic education, through providing remedial learning support services for under-performing students, supporting the education of academically well-performing secondary students in schools of excellence.

This initiative has been successful in meeting its programme objectives, with reports of students performing better academically, being more respectful of gender diversity, more enthusiastic about learning and developing strong team work skills. The initiative collaborates with parents and guardians of the supported children to ensure continuity of character education at home, at school and in the community, ensuring that the approach instills politeness, respect and punctuality, among other positive values.



Face of Imbuto-Kelie Umutoniwase

Twige Neza Dutsinde Programme



My name is Kelie Umutoniwase and I am one of the Faces of Imbuto under Twige Neza Dutsinde programme. This programme has been truly lifechanging for me during the 2021-2022 school year when I became one of the Imbuto Zitoshye/Edified Generation students supported by Imbuto Foundation.

Alongside 788 other students, I received a scholarship that helped me overcome financial challenges, which alleviated many of my worries and made a significant impact on my life.

With this support, I excelled academically and accomplished something extraordinary—I became the top-performing student in the Ordinary Level national exam for the 2022 - 2023 school year.

This achievement touched my heart and made me realise how such support can enable others to reach their full potential and provide hope to students facing similar obstacles. Programmes like "Twige Neza Dutsinde" are vital because they empower individuals like me to succeed, thereby enriching our communities by offering us with opportunities for learning and growth.



HEALTH PROGRAMMES







ADOLESCENT YOUTH SEXUAL REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH & RIGHTS (AYSRH&R) AND HIV



The AYSRH&R and HIV programme promotes positive behaviour among adolescents aged 10 to 24 years old. The programme targets adolescents both in and out of school, pairing schools and out of school clubs with youth organisations and health centres to provide youth-friendly services.

The programme also trains peer educators to raise awareness about HIV/AIDS and teaches adolescents to reduce the risks of unplanned pregnancies.

Face of Imbuto - Sandrine Mutuyimana AYSRH&R and HAV Programme



My name is Sandrine Mutuyimana and I live in Rubavu District. At 17, I had an unexpected pregnancy that could have derailed my dreams. My father abandoned us, and my then boyfriend pressured me to get an abortion, but I chose to keep my child. I hid my pregnancy and kept going to school until the school leadership found out and I was expelled.

I enrolled in a technical school for plumbing, despite my mother's initial resistance. Balancing school and pregnancy was tough, but I persevered. Just two days after giving birth.

I took my final exam and did well, which later allowed me to secure temporary jobs that helped me provide for my child and the rest of my family.

Through Vision Jeunesse Nouvelle (with the support of Imbuto Foundation), I joined Baho Neza and participated in Parent-Adolescent Communication Forums (PAC), which helped mend my relationship with my mother. With her support, I have returned to vocational school to pursue plumbing.

My journey with Imbuto Foundation taught me that with resilience, determination, and the necessary support, success is achievable even in the face of adversity.

FAMILY PLANNING



Face of Imbuto-Marthe Kayite

Family Planning Programme



Since this Niboye secondary post was established it has been a game-changer for women seeking family planning services. Women from low-income families, especially those managing small businesses, can now pass by early in the morning or in the afternoon.

This convenience means they can keep their businesses running smoothly without any interruptions. Before, they had to travel long distances to public health centres, where the long waits would throw off their entire day.

Now, at our secondary post, we can

offer comprehensive counselling on family planning methods to our community without such inconveniences.

Face of Imbuto-Leah Muhimana

Non - Communicable Diseases Programme



My name is Leah Muhimana, I am 43-year-old and I live in Kirimbi Sector in Nyamasheke District. Life hasn't been easy, but I found hope and strength through Baho Neza Initiative brought to us by FASACO, with the support of Imbuto Foundation.

I made the difficult decision to leave an abusive marriage to protect my children, but it led me into deep depression and uncertainty.

My turning point came when I met the Abahumurizamutima (Community Based Counselors) team, who introduced me to mental health safe spaces where I learnt a lot about my rights too. Initially hesitant, I decided to join their programme, and by the end of the 15-week long sessions, I had regained strength and determination.

As a single mother, I began rebuilding my family's life, starting with saving and investing 25,000 RWF in rice farming. Despite the challenges, I managed to buy the land we once rented, and now, I earn nearly 100,000 RWF with each harvest.

I am profoundly grateful to Baho Neza's "Twite ku buzima bwo mu mutwe" programme for giving us a new beginning.

- Enhanced youth leadership, participation, and engagement in national development.
- Improved entrepreneurial and social innovation skills among participating beneficiaries.
- Increased quality, productivity, and production in agriculture and livestock.



YOUTH LEADERSHIP AND ACTIVE CITIZENSHIP



The Youth Leadership and Active Citizenship programme aims at providing youth, of different socio-economic backgrounds, with the support and platforms to participate in leadership initiatives and be active members of the Rwandan society.

Through youth forums and training, the youth is encouraged to discuss and identify common solutions, while at the same time, being oriented towards personal development.

Face of Imbuto: Emmanuel Niyonsenga (KEZEM)

Youth Leadership & Active Citizenship Programme



My name is Emmanuel Niyonsenga and I am the CEO and Founder of KEZEM Fashion House. Raised by a single mother, I faced many challenges growing up, as my father was killed in the 1994 Genocide against the Tutsi before I was even born. Despite these hardships, I was fortunate to continue my education through university.

Even with a bachelor's degree in a different field, I chose to follow my true passion—fashion. With the support of Imbuto Foundation through the Art-Rwanda

Ubuhanzi programme, I launched KEZEM Fashion House in 2020. Today, our business proudly employs 15 permanent and 5 casual workers.

Attending Imbuto Foundation's mentorship programmes and youth forums has significantly enhanced my leadership and management skills, transforming me into a more active and engaged citizen. Through these experiences, I have gained the confidence and knowledge to lead effectively and contribute meaningfully to my community.

I urge my fellow youth to take advantage of similar opportunities to grow, learn, and become leaders who drive positive change in their communities.

ENTREPRENEURSHIP AND INNOVATION











The Entrepreneurship and Innovation programme aims at promoting job creation, creativity and entrepreneurial spirit among the youth, through initiatives such as ArtRwanda-Ubuhanzi and Innovation Accelerator.

The programme provides mentorship, training and financial support to young entrepreneurs and innovators, especially those seeking to provide solutions in response to challenges related to sexual reproductive health, comprehensive sexuality education, family planning, and mental health, among others.

Faces of Imbuto - Etienne Iryamukuru & Japhet Mazimpaka Entrepreneurship & Innovation Programme



The iAccelerator Programme has played a crucial role in supporting our '#BigombaGuhinduka' project, which focuses on addressing mental health stigma and improving access to information. In 2022, our project excelled in the competition, securing financial aid and benefiting from a comprehensive six-month business training program.

Currently, we have successfully reached over 20,000 university students and gained the support of 40,000 online followers. Using comic art, our initiative targets youth audiences, aiming to save lives by spreading critical information effectively. Our project has not only achieved financial success but has also established important partnerships that bolster our impact.

We are deeply grateful to the Imbuto Foundation and the iAccelerator Programme for providing us with the opportunity to make a meaningful difference in our communities. Their support has been invaluable in our journey towards success and sustainability.

of both mushroom tubes and fresh mushrooms. This growth not only boosted his business but also created job opportunities for 5 permanent employees and up to 25 casual workers, depending on the season.

Gildas also became more skilled in managing financial resources, allowing him to achieve his short-term goals on time. One of his most impressive accomplishments was using his sales income to purchase a 4,300-square-meter plot of land—a milestone that once seemed out of reach when he first joined the programme. Additionally, he generated an impressive 9 million Rwf from goods, which further fueled his business growth. This land acquisition provided a solid foundation for his future production premises, overcoming one of his biggest challenges and setting the stage for continued growth and success.




